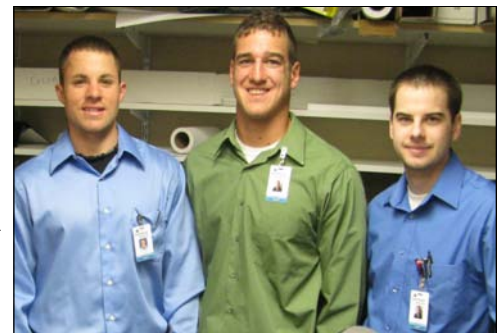

"NOTHING CAN PREPARE YOU"

I just want to give you a little glimpse of my trip to Joplin when we took medical and hygiene supplies and how appreciative the people were. The destruction is unbelievable and nothing can prepare you for what you see—nothing breaking up the landscape but total devastation—miles of rubble and heartache.

St. Johns Hospital is a total loss. How many lives were spared there is just a miracle. There was story after story about everyone coming to help in total darkness within hours; and emergency medical people coming from other states to help. After we unloaded our supplies, they asked if we would get other things for them such as pallets and items they needed to make temporary shelters. Again, there are no words to describe the devastation.

As one family put it: "Think of all your loved ones, your personal belongings, everything you hold dear to your heart and close your eyes but keep thinking about those items for 45 seconds. Then open your eyes and it is all gone —never to get it back. That is what it was like for us here in Joplin."

I ask you to keep on praying for the people in Joplin but also pray for the medical teams and rescue teams that are there, it is really taken a toll on them not only physically but mentally. I would not change this experience for anything because for me it was truly life changing.

We've Stepped It Up!

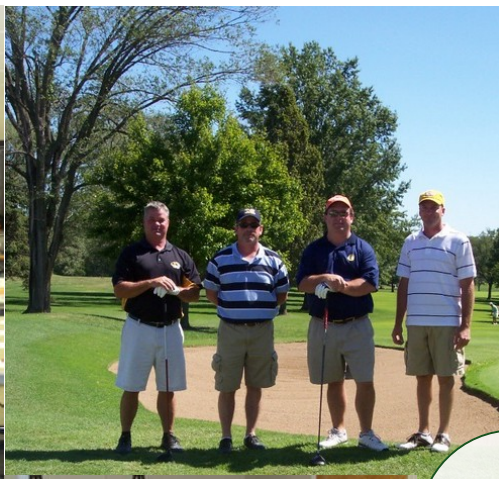
